RECLAIMING OUR YOUTH THROUGH TRIBAL COLLABORATION

The International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP), in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Justice's Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP), offers training that is designed to assist tribal law enforcement in developing a process for implementing effective plans that will address priority juvenile justice challenges in tribal nations. This workshop is appropriate for tribes with progressive philosophies that have the ability and infrastructure to address juvenile crime and delinquency and facilitate problem-solving in the community. Developed in conjunction with tribal justice professionals, this workshop:

- Assists native nations in identifying high-risk juvenile offenses specific to their nation with a specific focus on alcohol, drug use, and juvenile crime.
- Helps tribal law enforcement examine, develop, and implement effective plans for addressing priority juvenile justice problems.
- Provides an action-planning process that native nations can use to replicate in their communities.

The workshop is two and a half days, and is typically delivered to one large tribe or two to three smaller tribes with common issues, demographics, and goals. All stakeholders in the juvenile justice process are invited to participate in developing a plan to address issues agreed upon as critical.

Community Agencies to Consider Include:

The training requires that tribes submit an application indicating a commitment on behalf of tribal leadership. Key activities include an advance site visit to be conducted by IACP staff six-to-eight weeks prior to the workshop to collect relevant data necessary to tailor the training for the tribal nation.
